

New Rotary Club: One of my most exciting events of this Rotary year was helping launch the **Restoration Rotary Club**. Restoration Rotary is a cause-based virtual club that aims to address not only

addiction and mental health needs but the causes of these epidemics facing humanity. Many of the issues that contribute to and create substance abuse disorders and mental health issues also remove peace from a community and society at large. Crime, theft, violence, domestic abuse all play their part in creating environments that likely lead to addiction and lack of positive peace in a community.

First, a huge THANK YOU to all Rotarians that joined the two Zoom meetings on District Grants at the District Training Virtual Assembly. It was wonderful to see so many Rotarians learning about District Grants at the same time.

Based on those sessions, I wanted to send a reminder that the May 15, 2021 deadline for the 2021-2022 Rotary year District Grants is fast approaching. This deadline pertains to both the standard and competitive grant requests. Standard grants are available for up to \$1,750 per club (plus \$750 extra for those nine clubs qualifying for the bonus*).

We have three competitive grants available (two at \$10,000 and one at \$5,000). Each club may request only one standard grant and one competitive grant. Your grant request(s) for the 2021-2022 Rotary year must be accepted by the District no later than May 15. Please have your clubs designated grant representative submit your request prior to May 15th if possible so the grant(s) request can be reviewed by the District. That will give you time to make any suggested or required changes prior to the deadline.

Be sure to review the resources section on the [Districts Grants page](#) on our website prior to submitting your grant request(s). By reviewing the [DTA PowerPoint copy on the resources page](#) you will have a

step-by-step guide on how to navigate the District Grants section of the website and how to apply for your grant(s). Please do not hesitate to contact me with any questions. I am more than happy to help your club request the funds necessary to change lives in your community.

Rotary Leadership Institute transitioned to an online curriculum in 2020 because the Sunshine Division wanted Rotarians to have the opportunity to take advantage of the valuable resource that is RLI even though we could not host our usual in-person events. We have been excited to see many Rotarians participating in RLI that likely would not have attended a live event.

To access the course schedule, and to register, head over to rlitraining.org and follow these steps:

1. Click on Course Information, then Registration. This will take you the "Ready to Register?" Screen.

2. Scroll down and click on DACDB LOGIN
3. This will take you to DACdb.com
4. Sign in with your User Name and Password. (If you've never used DACdb before your user name is likely the email address associated with RI and your password is likely your RI member number).
5. After logging in click "District" on the ribbon at the top.
6. Click on the RLI button
7. In the My Club Shortcuts on the left side of the screen click on calendar (it's the last icon under My Club Shortcuts).
8. At the top of the page, be sure RLI Training Event is checked, and you will be able to see the calendar for RLI events.
9. Choose your event and click "Register Now"
10. From there you can input your information and pay.

Sunshine Division online RLI courses offer:

- Live presentations with our outstanding discussion leaders
- An interactive program, discussion-based training, with Rotarians from all over Georgia, Florida and the Caribbean
- The same great content in a convenient online format
- Each Part broken into sessions of one to two hours
- Sessions offered on a variety of days and times making it easier to attend
- The ability to register and pay for each session individually - at a cost of \$15 per individual session
- Materials and login information are provided with paid registration

All sessions of RLI Parts 1, 2 and 3 are available online. We've even had a group of RLI graduates who attended all their sessions virtually! You do not have to take the sessions or parts in any particular order, so you can pick and choose the sessions that interest you most from any part!

While RLI online is fun and convenient, it will never replace our in person events. We are happy to invite you to the first LIVE EVENT in District 6900 since January of 2020. This will be the Graduate Membership course only, to be held in Peachtree City on June 12, 2021 at the Midwest Food Bank, 200 Parkade Court, Peachtree City, Georgia 30269. We are going to start a little later than usual to allow folks to attend without having to drive in a day early for the event. We will be offering a continental breakfast as well as lunch for attendees. If you have completed Parts 1, 2 and 3, rather online or in person, we would love to see you at this graduate course in June. Will Watt, Sr. started GRSP as a member of the **Thomasville Rotary Club** at the conclusion of World War II. He founded GRSP to promote worldwide peace. Some 75 years later, 3,692 students have traveled to Georgia from 108 countries around the world to study in Georgia universities and colleges as a result of GRSP. During the 75th Anniversary event over 300 Rotarians and their guests will be in Thomasville to attend the event and honor the memory of Will Watt. We will also be dedicating a fountain and plaza celebrating GRSP.







Our guest speaker is Captain Donna Rowe, retired Army. Captain Rowe served as the Head ER/Triage nurse in Saigon, Vietnam - 1968-69. She took on the task of saving a barely alive Vietnamese baby girl from her dead mother’s arms.

Her story is featured in “The Kathleen Story” a permanent segment at the American History Museum. Donna and baby “Kathleen” are also featured in the documentary “The Shadow of the Blade”. In 2016 Captain Donna Rowe was honored as the first female inducted into the Georgia Military Veteran’s Hall of Fame. Roswell Rotary is dedicated to producing an annual event at the Memorial site incorporating the Holiday, Families and Community into one “great day of Remembrance.”


Volunteers from ages 18 to 85 packed 10,152 meals in just two hours! GSW student athletes, who rank third in the nation in community service hours, helped with set-up and break down of the assembly site on campus.

The venue had to be set up a bit differently to allow for social distancing, but that didn't stop students and Rotarians from quickly assembling the nearly 1,700 food bags (each serving 6 people) which contained soy, dehydrated vegetables, rice, and a vitamin packet. The students had so much fun during their first Rise Against Hunger event that they have asked if it could become an annual event on campus.

Rise Against Hunger is growing a global movement to end hunger by empowering communities, nourishing lives and responding to emergencies. Rise Against Hunger meal packaging volunteers produce millions of nutritious meals annually that are then distributed to partners in countries around the world. Officer Esposito was previously awarded the Police Medal of Valor. Lieutenant Matthew Bozer was awarded the Rotary Firefighter of the Year. All three were already employees of the year from each department.

To say that Alpharetta's Public Safety Department is exceptional is not an exaggeration. The Alpharetta 911 Communications Center is one of only six emergency contact centers in the world to earn Tri-ACE Certification issued by the International Academies of Emergency Dispatch, the highest distinction in emergency connection services. The Alpharetta Fire Department is one of 393 out of 40,000 fire departments nationwide to have a Public Protection Classification (PPC) rating of 1. The highest rating possible.

In the words of Chief John Robison, "we are not only there to protect and serve but to enhance the quality of life in Alpharetta. Our police, fire, and 911 departments operate from three core values. 1)Courageous Spirit - Risks of the job are real. We persevere in the face of adversity. 2)Selfless Service - Put the welfare of the public above your own and add value to others. 3)Excellence with integrity - Do what is right and do it well."

Moultrie Feeds Local Community



The **Rotary Club of Moultrie** participated in the USDA “Farmers to Families” program to provide meals to Moultrie citizens. Partnering with the United Way and Trinity Baptist Church, a food box distribution event was planned for April 10.

As the day arrived, so did the threat of severe thunderstorms in the area. Thankfully, the delivery truck was early and the volunteers plentiful. At the final count there were over 50 volunteers from Rotary, United Way, Trinity Baptist Church, Moultrie Fire Department, Moultrie Police Department, Publix, Southern Powder Coating, American Red Cross, and the UGA Archway Partnership all working together to move boxes and make it happen.

Every single one of the 1,100 food boxes (30 pounds each) were given away, loaded into 312 different vehicles. The pallets were emptied in just over three hours and the last box drove away right before the rain started – so the people and the timing were both perfect for a great event. The food boxes provided over 20,000 meals to the Moultrie community. There are plans to bring at least one more truck to Moultrie before the program closes out, and with the great community partnerships being established it is sure to be another success.
