## An Update from Shelter Box

*.Editor's Note: This article reports on what Shelter Box is doing to help residents and refugees of Ukraine. Keep in mind that you can also support Ukrainian relief by contributing to the District Fund for that purpose, or to the Rotary Foundation's Disaster Relief Fund with contributions earmarked for Ukraine.*

Shelter Box reports that its aid has arrived in Lviv in western Ukraine and distributions begin this week. The number of people who've had to leave their homes is close to 10 million - that's almost a quarter of Ukraine's population. Over four million children are among those displaced (more than half of the country's estimated 7.5 million child population). Shelter Box is working on three projects - two within Ukraine and one supporting those fleeing the country. Want to help?
