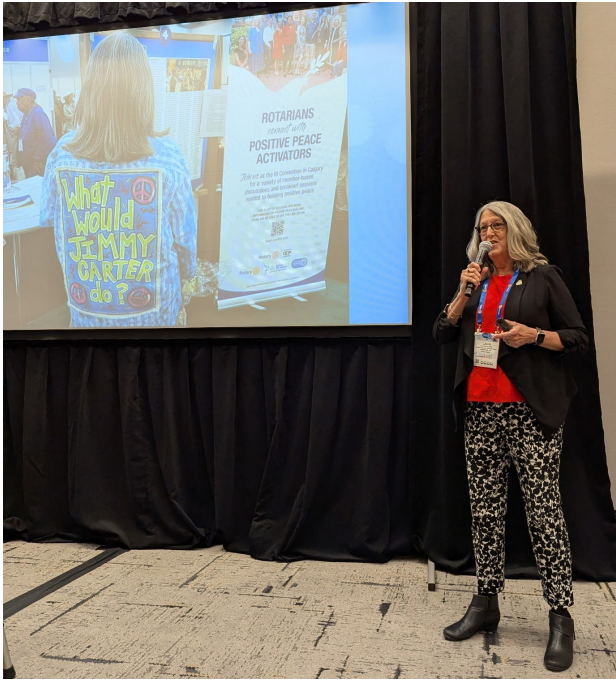
## Roswell Shares Strategies for Launching Interact Clubs

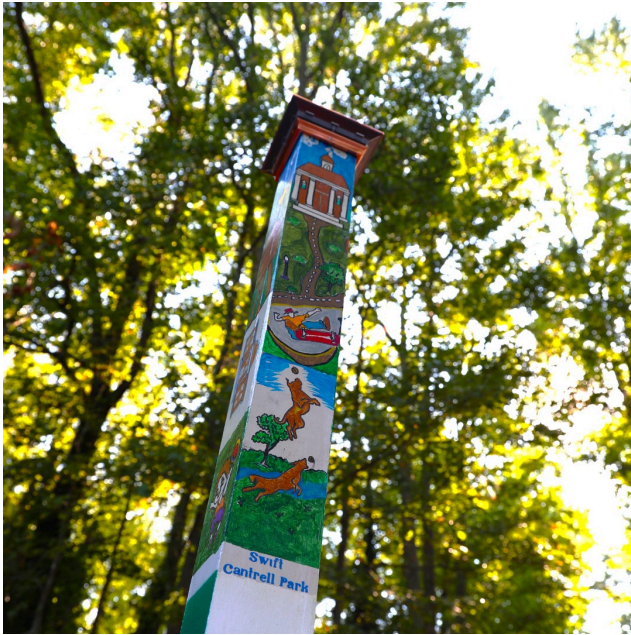
