Honored Guest Speaker Dr. Jere Morehead President, University of Georgia



## Today's Guest Speaker Dr. Jere Morehead President, University of Georgia

Jere W. Morehead became the University of Georgia's 22nd President on July 1, 2013, having previously served as UGA's Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost since 2010.

President Morehead's career covers a wide range of faculty and administrative roles. Prior to 2010, he served UGA in several key administrative assignments, including Vice President for Instruction, Vice Provost for Academic Affairs, Associate Provost and Director of the Honors Program, and acting Executive Director of Legal Affairs. From 2003 to 2010, he served as the University's Faculty Athletics Representative. As UGA President, he also serves as Chair of the Georgia Athletic Association Board of Directors, Chair of the UGA Research Foundation, a UGA Foundation Trustee, and a UGA Real Estate Foundation Trustee.

President Morehead is a member of the Council on Competitiveness as well as the Committee of Research Intensive Public Universities convened by the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities. He also serves as a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I Presidential Forum, the Southeastern Conference (SEC) Executive Committee, and the SEC Working Group on Student-Athlete Conduct. He formerly chaired the SEC Working Group on Compliance, Enforcement, and Governance.

President Morehead is the Meigs Professor of Legal Studies in the Terry College of Business, where he has held a faculty appointment since 1986. He is a co-author of several books and book chapters, including The Legal and Regulatory Environment of Business, and he has published scholarly articles on legal topics ranging from export controls to jury selection. He has served as Editor-in-Chief of the American Business Law Journal and previously held several other editorial board positions with the ABLJ.

He directed the UGA Law School's Advocacy Program from 1986 to 1995 at a time when the moot court teams he coached won international, national, regional and state championships. In 1995, he served as a visiting professor of business law at the University of Michigan.

President Morehead has received several University-wide teaching awards, including the Josiah Meigs Award— UGA's highest honor for teaching excellence—the Richard B. Russell Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching, the Teacher of the Year Award in the Terry College of Business, and the Lothar Tresp Outstanding Honors Professor Award. He also received the Distinguished Service Scroll Award, the Law School Alumni Association's highest honor, and has been included in Georgia Trend's list of Most Influential Georgians for six consecutive years.

Morehead is a native of Lakeland, Florida. He moved with his family to Atlanta as a teenager and enrolled at Georgia State University after graduating from high school at the age of 16. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in 1977. He entered the University of Georgia School of Law in 1977, where he graduated with a juris doctor degree at the age of 23 in 1980. After graduation, he served as an Assistant United States Attorney with the Department of Justice from 1980 to 1986. He is the first alumnus of UGA to serve as President since 1986.

Sunshine was spread by several members including President Jesse, **Jim Peeler**, Mary Ansley Southerland and **Mark Barbour**. The common theme of all was proud feelings about their offspring.

**Don Barbour** introduced the program for the day. Don indicated as a Emory graduate he is especially proud to introduce the speaker. Benjamin Fischer-Valuck, MD is the Assistant Professor in the Department of Radiation Oncology at Emory. He treats patients with lung, prostate or gastrointestinal cancer at Emory St. Joseph's Hospital. Dr. Fischer-Valuck has a medical degree from LSU and served his residency at Washington University in St. Louis.

Dr. Fischer-Valuck expressed appreciation for the invitation to speak, He said he felt close to Rotary in that his brother is the President Elect of the Jacksonville, IL Rotary club.

The focus of his presentation was a new form of radiation therapy available in the Metro area called Proton Therapy. He said the therapy has been available for about 10 years but is new to Atlanta at the Emory Proton Center near Emory Midtown Hospital (Old Crawford Long Hospital).

Dr. Fischer-Valuck's visual presentation highlighted Prostate Cancer which has several methods of treatment. He said it is one of the most common types of cancer. One out of nine men will have it. 165,000 cases each year with 60,000 using radiation therapy for treatment. There are several ways to treat it. Implanting radioactive seeds is a form of treatment and radiation machines is another. A new way is Proton radiation which minimizes the damage to the surrounding tissue. It has proved to be very useful in treating brain, prostate and bladder cancer. It can give higher doses without damaging other functions. A patient can be referred to the Proton Center by any physician.

President Jesse expressed appreciation to Dr. Fisher-Valuck and indicated a book will be presented to a Marietta Elementary school to honor his presentation.

The opportunity drawing was coordinated by **Amber Patterson** and **Lee Pence**. **Jack Corn** won both draws and secured the red ball on the second try. Congratulations Jack.

Past President Jim Kellogg led the pledge to the flag and the 4-way test recitation.

President Jesse adjourned the meeting.
