Our guest speaker, Phil Smith, was introduced by Rotalight Editor Deborah Marshall. Phil is the National Field Director of the Concord Coalition a non-profit and nonpartisan organization whose mission is to enlighten and encourage fiscal responsibility about our federal budget. A University of Georgia graduate, Phil is a Past President of the Atlanta Kiwanis Club. He is a 2011 graduate of Leadership Atlanta where he currently serves as the

Alumni Membership Chairman. Phil is a 2006 graduate of Leadership Georgia and has received gubernatorial appointments to the boards of directors of the Georgia Humanities Council and the Georgia Children and Youth Coordinating Council. In 2005, Phil was chosen as one of the top "40 Under 40" by the Atlanta Business Chronicle.



Phil began with a graph showing our U.S. debt is on an unsustainable path. Historically the national debt has remained flat except during the depression of the 1930's and wars (WWI, WWI, and Vietnam). However, since 2015, the deficit has steadily risen to over \$22 trillion today interest on this debt is currently \$316 billion yearly. If the interest rate rises by 1%, the federal interest expense will top \$1 trillion by 2028. The primary health care programs, including Medicare, Medicaid, are pushing up costs, and with the American population aging these costs and Social Security will continue to increase. By 2022 the outlay of this program will surpass the revenue.

Currently, over 50 percent of our national debt is owned by foreign governments, primarily China.

In closing, Phil stated the following key points:

- Current fiscal policy is unsustainable
- There are no easy solutions, such as cutting waste, fraud and abuse or growing our way out of the problem.
- Finding solutions will require bipartisan cooperation and a willingness to discuss all options.
- Public engagement and understanding are vital in finding solutions.
- This is not about numbers. It is a moral issue.

After many questions and appreciation from the audience, President Jesse thanked our speaker and presented a children's book to a Marietta City School in his name.

The opportunity drawing held with **Jim Trapnell** and **Becky Sawyer** unsuccessfully vying for the red ball.

Sandeep Kapoor ended the meeting with the pledge to the flag and 4-way test.
