Minutes from the November 13 Meeting

Very freshly elected President Elect Nominee **Will Allen** was then summoned to the Podium to introduce our esteemed, notable medical Guest Speaker, Dr. Avril Beckford. Prior to P.E.N. Will's introductory remarks, he made mention that "if and or when Past President Judge Reuben Green asks you to serve as a Director... be warned, he does not tell you that serving as a Director sets you up to be nominated to be President of the Club!" Duly noted and Judge Green's keen recruitment of Rotarian Allen duly commended! Squirm as he may, barrister Allen will indeed compliment the honorable bestowment of this prestigious responsibility as he joins that "great cloud of witnesses" who have preceded him thusly in such an honorable and lofty place of service! PEN Allen then gave a laudable introduction of our Speaker's exceptional medical credentials and background noting that Dr. Beckford's husband had "out-punted his coverage when marrying the doctor," and, we all would "enjoy what she says and the accent with which she says it". Indeed, Dr. Beckford's South African accent made her remarks charmingly engaging! Dr. Beckford extended a heartfelt thank you for the opportunity to speak to our Club and to "partner" with our Club in our centennial literacy book project. Then she was expedient to point out that "I have figured out where the naughty table is...pointing to where Doug Haynie, Jeffrey Long, Don Barbour, Bill Smith, Marlys Williams, and our award winning ROTALIGHT Editor, Deborah Marshall were all seated... rowdiest Rotarians indeed seated among the more serenely dispositioned Rotarians Fred Beloin and Mark Barbour (LOL!).

Thereafter the serendipitous synchronistic nature of today's meeting unfolded as revealed by Dr. Beckford. It seems that her husband had left South Africa as a Rotary Exchange Student in 1985, coming to Tucumcara, New Mexico. Through his 'Rotary adoption' into his new 'New Mexico Rotary Family' he would "fall in love with the American way of life". He would return to South Africa and through a "series of unintended Rotary associated consequences and events" "meet, marry, and passionately persuade" his wife, Dr. Beckford, to come to America. Dr. Beckford stated, "if it wasn't for Rotary, I would not be here!" Fortunately, providentially fortuitous to be sure! She then related her professional gratification for the emergence of WellStar Pediatrics as one of the stellar Pediatrics Health Care Departments in our State noting that "in 1972, our Pediatric Department was almost shut-down." Her personal insight and proficiency in presenting relevant information about children's healthcare, emotional, mental, and physical development was exceptional. She likewise referred to her avid support of our centennial literacy project by relating a story that she previously shared at our recent "Gin and Phonics" event regarding a young father with a small child "with tremendous breathing problems." It seems this father had an aversion to accepting the benefits of reading to his baby "who can't understand what I'm reading." Dr. Beckford's, along with her staff's gracious coaxing, led to the father's agreement to read to his ailing infant. After a few weeks, the "holding, reading, and connecting to his baby led to remarkable results..."; "nurses had their ears to the door". Said Dr. Beckford, and she found them at the door crying one day; "what's wrong," she asked her group of nurses, "the dad is actually reading to his baby...it's beautiful." The father would later remark, "Hey Doc, thanks for telling me about this reading stuff...no one ever read to me...it really works." Dr. Beckford related in her comments that "we all presume from different frames of reference...connecting, touching, holding, reading...I'm in a room full of people who understand the importance of holding and reading to

babies." "Your commitment to giving the [reading] packets to parents at WellStar will make such a difference". Providential serendipity that Dr. Arvil Beckford of South Africa would marry a Rotarian who would lead her to come across the big pond to eventually come to Marietta to embrace and endorse our Rotary Club of Marietta literacy action project in our 100th year of "Service Above Self!" Further remarks were made about Pediatric inoculations and thereafter during our routine time of questions from the floor, insight regarding flu vaccinations, DTAP (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis), and Pneumococcal Pneumonia 'booster shots' were provided by the good doctor. Dr. Beckford strongly urged all Rotarians to initiate and receive the DTAP, Flu and Pneumococcal vaccinations.

President Chris then presented our "coveted" 100th Anniversary Globe to Dr. Avril along with the promise to present a book to a Marietta Elementary School in her honor. **Holly Walquist** and **Jeff Couch** were our conveyors of the 'Opportunity Drawing' and alas the red oblong-like marble was elusively evasive...Lady Luck happily skipped out of the room.

Our accustomed practice of avid recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag then took place followed by our weekly equally boisterous recitation of the "Four Way Test of the Things We Think, Say, and Do" was well led by our very diligent "Crutches 4 Africa" Service Project Coordinator Richard Cope. And we were all once again pronounced adjourned after yet another commendable Rotary Club of Marietta Wednesday mid-week meeting during our 100th year of making an exceptional difference in our community, district, and world... "It's a great day to be a Rotarian!"
