Joyette Holmes (herself a UGA graduate) introduced our speaker, Hamilton E. Holmes, Jr. Mr. Holmes was born in Detroit and spent his early childhood in Nuremberg before moving back to Atlanta, where he grew up. He attended Northside High School and earned a BBA from the University of Georgia and an MBA from Mercer. He worked with such corporate giants as AT&T and Lockheed Martin. He is presently the business development director with Pieper O'Brien Herr Architects. He is the son of the late Hamilton Holmes, M.D., who, along with Charlayne Hunter, integrated the University of Georgia in 1961.

Unfortunately, the integration of the University of Georgia, while significantly smoother than the process at some other large southern land-grant universities, was not without its

difficulties. And so, 174 years after Georgia's flagship public university and the birthplace of public higher education in America was chartered, Hamilton Holmes applied for admission. That admission proved elusive, so he sued in the United States District Court for the Middle District of Georgia. Thereafter, Judge Bootle effectively ordered the Registrar at the University to admit both Holmes and Hunter. Holmes and Hunter v. Danner, 134 F.Supp. 394 (M.D. Ga. 1961). After ugly campus gatherings of many UGA students, Dean William Tate and the Georgia State Patrol were finally able to escort Holmes and Hunter to class, and, eventually, they both graduated.

A poignant statement from our speaker was that many fellow students privately expressed support for Holmes and Hunter but were afraid to publicly stand with them in their endeavor.

Mr. Holmes' speech was very warmly received by Marietta Rotary, including the many University of Georgia alumni who are members. There was a standing ovation.

The opportunity drawing was administered by **Teresa Jones** and Abbott Hall, but there was no winner this time. **Dan Kirk** led the pledge and the four-way test, and then the meeting was adjourned.
