# THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Georgia Department of Labor

Mark Butler, Commissioner Georgia's of Department of Labor, spoke to Griffin Rotarians and their quests on trends and challenges in employment in Georgia. Butler noted that the state's unemployment rate is at 4.4% placing Georgia at 31<sup>st</sup> in the U.S. But, he hastened to add that Georgia is also  $5^{th}$  in the nation in job creation and  $6^{th}$  or  $7^{th}$  in putting people to work. He explained that the difference in these statistics reflects the growth in the workforce in the state. "I am concerned about those people who want to work," he said. "My job is to place people who want to work in jobs." Since 2011, the number of jobs in the state has increased by 17%, and the rate of placing people in jobs has increased 16%. Butler noted that during that time, our workforce has grown only 8% while the number of unemployed has remained the same. "That

indicates that more people are moving into Georgia," he said. "It's growth." Approximately 200,000 are not employed in Georgia and want to work, he added. And, there are 100,000 to 120,000 available jobs as posted online. "That gap is because those wanting to work lack the technical and 'soft' skills to qualify for those available jobs," Butler said. Those soft skills include interviewing properly, showing up to work, and passing a drug test. While several in the audience indicated that this lack of soft skills is most frequently seen in young people, Butler said that many adults seeking work also lack those skills. While young people may have educational avenues to help correct or improve these skills, adults do not. He encouraged mentoring adults. "If you see adults working three jobs, you know they are workers," he said. He offered that mentoring them in time and money management could be the answer. Butler also observed that there is a problem in a business when you see entry level positions filled with 30-year-olds rather than recent graduates. He suggested those adults may also need mentoring to advance their careers. He concluded his presentation by repeating that the number one issue for his department is to pay attention to those in the workforce looking for employment and how to get them into good jobs. When asked about the possibility of Amazon settling in Georgia, he commented that Georgia can address those anticipated workforce needs because (1) not all the positions associated with that more (or other such moves) will be open immediately and at once, and (2) many of the jobs created with that move will be filled from people moving into the state. He likened that to the move of a new industry to our own community.
