THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Her Essay Changed Lives



Jackie Harmon

When Jackie Harmon was a senior at Griffin High School in 2012, she thought the required English essay on Laws of Life was just another annoying assignment. But, Jackie told us on Thursday that the process of writing and presenting that essay "changed my life." Her essay captured the turmoil and hardships that she and her mother had experienced in living in her mom's truck without a home, Jackie arriving at school before everyone to clean up before school, and eating free breakfast and lunch provided while saving unperishable foods to take to her mom after school dismissal. The essay went on to tell of how a school counselor helped Jackie and her mom find a local shelter for abused and battered women. There, her mom learned and earned a certificate in cosmetology

which landed her a job and eventually an apartment so she and Jackie were no longer homeless. Jackie's essay told us that when hardships occur, we cannot just endure them; we must know that we are not alone and that there are others who care and can help as you find ways to overcome those hardships. As Jackie read that 2012 essay to us, she was visibly shaken by words she had not read in years. She said, "The first time I told my story was to Griffin Rotary [in 2012]," She shared that she immediately was offered, and accepted, parttime employment at Piggly Wiggly. "There were lots of other offers," she said. "My life changed." Jackie joined the Georgia National Guard which supplemented scholarships to Mercer University. She completed her bachelor's with multiple majors including biomedical engineering. She is now working on a Master's degree. And, just as we thought we were watching a "fairy tale ending," Jackie explained a few bad incidents that had occurred since that 2012 essay. She was attacked by a former boyfriend who stalked her forcing her to relocate several times. In October 2015, her mother was murdered by an exboyfriend. She went to court to get legal custody of her three younger siblings (the youngest is now 15). She cracked some vertebrae in a collision caused by a distracted driver. That took considerable rehabilitation and she lost her chance at a commission as an officer in the US Army National Guard. Yet, Jackie continues to be positive and she is progressing in her life and goals. It is apparent that she is living that Law of Life she explained so well in her 2012 essay - don't just endure hardships, but work to conquer them. She concluded, "If I remain focused on working hard, the Lord will provide."



Stephanie Windham

Stephanie Windham introduced Jackie Harmon as our program speaker on Thursday. The year that Stephanie was President was 2012 when Jackie presented her essay. She shared that Jackie's essay had changed her life, too. She quoted the German philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche, "That which does not kill us makes us stronger," in alluding to Jackie's experiences. Stephanie said she had learned from that example. "It changed my life." Stephanie has since been highly active in the Georgia Laws of Life Essay competition every year since her club presidency. She serves at the District level in coordinating this Character Building component of Rotary. Stephanie also encouraged anyone wishing to judge submitted essays this year to contact her.
