THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Communication and Connecting



Daryl Fletcher is a 6-foot 7-inch tall keynote speaker, author, and relationship expert. In his presentation, Fletcher emphasized that the key element to success – whatever that success may be – is communication. "Communication touches every aspect of our lives," he said. He listed four conversations that occur in communication. Those are what is *said* versus what is *heard*, and what is meant versus what is felt. It is crucial in our communications that what is said and heard are the same, and what is meant and felt are the same. Fletcher quickly noted that communication is not about talking, but rather about connecting with others. He used a very visual demonstration to emphasize his point in having Chuck Copeland, Steve Crouch, and John Rainwater come up and attempt to give him a High-Five. After some jumps, all three 'connected' with the High-Five. But, Fletcher used the illustration to show how we might not be connecting with others in our communication. "Are you connecting, or are you

just talking"" he asked. He also encourages his listeners and clients to change our "filters" in our lives. He suggested changing our "value filter" to insure that we view every individual as valuable. Changing the "appreciation filter" logically follows because as we value a person, we also appreciate his/her views, thoughts and contributions. "You don't have to agree with someone to appreciate them," he added. And, following with that point, he emphasized that understanding the views of others is important but often challenging. And, finally, he underscored that we must change or add a filter for listening. "We must be able to listen," he said. "In fact, the most frequent reason for failures in communicating is the absence of listening." Fletcher shared that he is living testimonial that these steps are key to successful relationships. He attributed the end of his 16-year marriage to his inability to communicate, to connect, and to listen. Adopting the steps he teaches was a choice he made to be better and not bitter. History of St. Patrick and His Day



On March 17th each year, many across the globe celebrate St. Patrick's Day. The celebration began as a religious festival in the 17^{th} Century in observance of the death of St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland. Did you know that St. Patrick was not Irish, but rather English? Maewyn Succot was born in 386 AD and was kidnapped at age 16 by Irish invaders and forced to shepherd. He became a devout Christian and escaped following the voice he believed to be God's. He returned to England, studied to be a missionary, and returned to Ireland to convert many Irish pagans to Christianity, respecting the Irish culture as he did so. He even used the three leaves of the shamrock (Irish clover) to explain the Holy Trinity to the pagans.

The first St. Patrick's Day Celebration actually occurred in New York City rather than Ireland when Irish soldiers fighting for the British marched through the streets. There are now over 100 parades celebrating the day in the U.S. alone.
