HELP END HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN OUR COMMUNITY BY HELPING TO INCREASE AWARENESS

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM UGA Center for Food Safety

The safety of the foods we consume is of major importance to each of us. And, reports of outbreaks of foodborne illnesses underscore the importance of insuring that we have a safe and secure food supply. The UGA Center for Food Safety (CFS) located on the Griffin Campus stands at the cutting edge of research, policy development, as well as mobilizing to assist in mitigating outbreaks of foodborne illnesses. Dr. Francisco Diaz-Gonzalez, Director of the CFS, shared the history and the mission of the Center Thursday's program. The Center was for established in 1993 under the leadership of Dr. Michael Doyle, who recently retired. It was first known as the Center for Food Safety and Quality Enhancement but was changed to the Center of Food Safety in 2001 as the focus of the Center shifted entirely to food safety. The mission of the Center is to maintain and improve the safety of foods through the development of methods

that detect, control, or eliminate pathogenic microorganisms or their toxins in foods and food products. Center scientists conduct research aimed at solving these problems. Although they do not teach formal courses, they advise and mentor graduate students working in their programs, a role in which Griffin Campus faculty have served for decades. Seven faculty and one Emeritus faculty, Dr. Larry Beuchat, work on a variety of foodborne pathogens and projects within the Center on the Griffin Campus. Adding to that expertise are 19 adjunct faculty who are in different UGA departments and even in different universities and agencies. Francisco noted that each food safety issue requires several areas of expertise to solve problems. Poultry, Georgia's top agricultural commodity, is one of the major emphases for the Center. Three faculty recently formed the Food Safety Informatics Group to focus on genomic epidemiology, bioinformatics, and metagenomics. The 40,000 square foot Center is a biosafety level 2 facility with 10 microbiology labs and five recently-renovated laboratories. It is one of the largest food safety research and educational facilities in the country. A board of advisors, consisting of representatives and stakeholders from many wellknown commercial companies, help identify research needs. Francisco feels the keys to the success of the CFS is the strong collaboration with government agencies, such as the CDC; hosting the CDC Food Industry Safe Food Forum, and; the faculty at the CFS. The CFS has strong credibility with the food industry and the government.

Before speaking on Food Safety on Thursday, Dr. Diaz-Gonzalez talked about how Rotary, and especially one Rotarian, had influenced his life. The late Barlow Ware (1925-2011), who was known as "Mr. Foundation" in his club, was a light of hope for Francisco and helped him to complete his master's degree at Cornell University. Francisco had spent 7 years in Monterey, Mexico, before bringing his

family to Ithaca, NY to attend Cornell. Francisco became a Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar during the period of 1991 to 1992 and, while in Ithaca, interacted with several Rotary clubs and even visited Rotary International headquarters in Evanston, IL. Francisco was made a Paul Harris Fellow by Mr. Ware who worked at Cornell and lived Rotary's Service Above Self.
