# DOWIS URGES FLEXIBILITY, EXPLORATION AND FUN IN SERVICE TO OTHERS

In his visit to Griffin Rotary, District 6900 Governor Court Dowis said that Rotary cannot be an effective service organization without an active membership. He urged us to attract new members by having socials that include prospective members, have those prospects assist in a service project, and seat them with groups at meetings that will address the prospects' goals in being a Griffin Rotarian. He explained that the 28- to 35-year-old members are just starting their careers and are looking to network. The 45- to 60-year-old members have established careers and are ready to "give back". They are often the "workhorses" in service clubs. The more mature members (60+ years old) like to visit with their friends but are a tremendous resource as mentors in the club. Dowis hinted that this demographic info could not only help attract members but also retain them. He further suggested that we explore any and all options for securing grants to support service projects, global or otherwise. Partnering with interested community groups can be a key ingredient. He added that all Rotarians must continue to support the Rotary Foundation and its Annual Fund, Endowment Fund, and Polio Plus. Substantial progress has been made in Rotary's efforts to eradicate polio, but we must continue to support the immunization program. He concluded by urging everyone to follow their passions in service and to enjoy and have fun in doing so.

Gabriel reports that he traveled with two other GRSP students to the conclave. He learned about the history and traditions of GRSP and, for the first time, met all the other students participating in the

program this year. "It was wonderful to meet people from all around the world, talk to them, learn about their cultures, and feel respect and friendship," he said. He wrote, "We are constructing memories, and I am certain that each of us had this feeling of equality in our diversity. I have never known so many people with different backgrounds before and, personally, that weekend makes me conscious of our whole global community. We could really see that diversity on Saturday night as everyone performed on stage. I was impressed with the Scottish instrument (bagpipe), with the performance of the students from Zimbabwe, the unique instruments and dances, and the funny moments. I and five other Brazilian students performed the song *Girl from Ipanema* by Tom Jobim. I also played acoustic guitar with two students from Sweden and Germany as they sang *Gabriella's Song* in German, Swedish, and English. I cannot wait to meet the other students again. I already miss them all."
