# SQUARE FOOT MINISTRY WANTS LOCAL VOLUNTEERS

Jeff Williams, Executive Director of Square Foot Ministry (SFM), spoke on the mission and works of SFM, a Christian-based non-profit based in Fayette County. SFM's primary mission is to "transform neighborhoods and lives", and much of their effort is invested in the Fairmont Community here in Griffin. To date, SFM has built 10 homes, a children's park, a women's shelter, and a food bank in and around Fairmont. The SFM approach involves neighborhood transformation, community care, and community partnerships. Transformation follows partnering with deserving families, donors, and volunteers to construct homes in "challenged" neighborhoods. Their community care focuses on engaging these selected families in teaching how to care for their new home investments and providing no-interest mortgages at low monthly payments on the principle. Community partnerships build and expand facilities for other non-profits who serve the needs of the community. Building homes is a major undertaking with the majority of the land clearing and house construction done by volunteers. Each 1100 to 1200 square foot house requires about 160 volunteers to complete and costs \$80,000 to \$85,000. About 90 to 95% of the volunteer force is from Fayette County, and Williams wants to build a network of volunteers here in Griffin. SFM will complete two additional houses on Lynn Lane in mid-November, and three additional lots have been secured for home constructions in Fairmont. Funding for their work comes from churches, individual or organization donations, and grants from Christian-based groups. They also invest the funds collected from their mortgage payments into their fund.
