Judge Grubbs welcomed our speaker, J.K. Murphy, the Managing Editor of the Marietta Daily Journal and Past President of the Gwinnett Rotary Club.

J.K.'s focus was the impact of the digital revolution upon all areas of life nowadays and newspaper publishing in particular. He compared the Industrial Revolution spanning the past 250 years with today's digital stampedes in cameras, music, movies and grocery shopping, where change occurs as fast as a finger snap. Newspaper publishers are challenged as their print and online reading audiences become more transitory and largely believe that news should be free and suit their convenience. These challenges place huge demands on newspaper's advertising revenues. Between them, Google Search and Facebook comprise 58-percent of the digital advertising market that now generates more billions of dollars than TV

advertising. Referencing Joe Pompey's article in *Vanity Fair* last month describing a conversation between A.G. Sulzberger, Sam Dolnick and David Perpich—cousins all at the *New York Times*; J.K. seized upon Sulzberger's observation about the Times' future, "The time will come when this is a digitalonly news organization." Sulzberger added, "Advertising will never be enough to pay for quality journalism." Positives for digital news publishers include 24/7 coverage, widespread accessibility to video and audio media, global audiences and immediate feedback from the consuming public.

In thanking J.K., President Jesse held aloft a copy of *Uni the Unicorn and the Dream Come True* that will be donated in J.K.'s honor to an elementary school in Marietta. President Jesse then welcomed **Bill Dunaway** back at his usual table and underscored Rotary's joint meeting with Kiwanis on December 12th.
